Director's Comments: This resolution will complete the SEQR process for the 2020 addition to the County's Agricultural District Program.

Director's Comments:

In order to keep pace with the demands of solar and battery energy storage development, the Planning Department requested funding from NYSERDA to hire an independent contractor or PT employee temporarily for 2 years to serve as a Solar Coordinator (SC) to support our municipalities and work cooperatively with the County. NYSERDA informed us that it plans to fund the application. Various activities include:

- Assist towns with municipal solar & energy storage law development
- Assist local boards in navigating the application review process; help them to identify their needs, and access resources and consultants.
- Review draft energy laws and moratoria
- Contribute to the County-maintained database of solar/BESS resources for municipalities and the County, including model & existing solar laws.
- Provide training resources on the Accelerated Renewable Energy Growth & Community Benefit Act (Section 94-c).
- Provide support to municipalities with Article 10 projects in transition to or new projects under the Section 94-c process. Specific tasks to be identified after the State issues guidance.
- Work cooperatively with the County to deliver County sponsored training workshops to Supervisors, Code Enforcement Officers, Planning & Zoning Board members, Clerks, Assessors and general citizens on topics including energy law development and implementation
- Provide status updates of Solar/Energy Storage in Livingston County to Supervisors, involved County Departments, and County Boards
- Assist with landowner/solar company inquiries- provide local contacts, or solar resources for landowner considerations.

CONESUS LAKE WATERSHED MANAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

Conesus Lake Watershed Council. Next meeting is November 20, 2020, where the work plan for 2021 will be established.

Watershed Education Center at Vitale Park (WEC). Recent presentation: Urban Forestry Grants (October 21). The WEC Program Development Committee continues its work on the presentation schedule for 2021. Upcoming presentations: Trains, Planes and Boats 1874 to 1970 (November 18), Research Update (December 8).

AGRICULTURAL AND FARMLAND PROTECTION BOARD

303b Petitions. The Board of Supervisors designated the month of September as the thirty-day annual period for submission of petitions by landowners to join an existing Agricultural District. The AFPB reviewed three petitions for inclusion and is recommending the inclusion of three parcels in the Towns of Ossian and Springwater. The public hearing date is set for November 18, 2020.

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Agricultural District #1 Renewal. Livingston County has contracted with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Livingston County to assist in the renewal of Agricultural District #1. To date, 40% have responded – 142 property owners (824 parcels) wish to be included in the district, and 24 property owners (43 parcels) do not wish to be included in the district. Reminder mailings will be sent out in November.

ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COUNCIL (EMC)

Next meeting. The next meeting is scheduled for November 18.

COUNTY PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board now has a dedicated email: LCPlanningBoard@co.livingston.ny.us. Referrals can be submitted to this email.

Next meeting. The next meeting is scheduled for November 12.

LET'S Plan. Reminder: "Evenings with the County Planning Board" is an opportunity for municipal training credit hours. Municipal planning and zoning officials may receive credit for attending and learning about County Planning Board review. Those interested should call the Planning Department beforehand to learn about the agenda and ensure that a meeting is being held. Meeting cancellations are rare, but do happen.

GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS (GIS) & MAPPING

The County has launched a beta version of its updated interactive County map for review and comment.

SOLAR INTERNSHIP/SUNY GENESEO. An intern from SUNY Geneseo is evaluating the impact of present, planned, and future solar projects on Livingston County land resources. A preliminary presentation was given to the AFPB on October 21. Future presentations are planned to the County Planning Board, Environmental Management Council, and Development Review Committee.

GENESEE TRANSPORTATION COUNCIL (GTC)

Comprehensive Mobility Management Strategy. The County was awarded 2020-2021 UPWP funding to prepare a comprehensive mobility management strategy. The purpose of the project is to analyze existing mobility management in the County, specifically for program level transportation needs and demands through human service agencies (DSS, OFA, DOH/Mental Health, Probation, Veterans Services, and others). The Strategy will examine demand generated by public programming, the efficiencies, opportunities, public funding sources, contracts, and other transportation related functions across County operations. The resolution on the agenda for today's meeting authorizes a contract with TransPro to complete the work.

SPECIAL PROJECTS

LIVINGSTON COUNTY WATER SUPPLY STUDY UPDATE PROJECT. We are currently receiving municipal and public comments on the draft document. Planning staff started developing a proposed implementation strategy and assessing alternatives for shared services for consideration by the towns and villages. We started developing a framework for the Akzo Settlement Committee policies, procedures and process for making recommendation(s) to the Board of Supervisors.

RADIO COMMUNICATIONS UPGRADE PROJECT. We finalized the contract with Mid-State Construction & Electronics for purchase of the towers for the Livonia and Groveland sites. We anticipate mid-November delivery of the towers to the County Highway Department at Hampton Corners. We issued both the bid documents for tower site construction and the request for proposals for the antennas and related equipment on October 22. Responses are due on November 13. We tentatively plan awarding contracts for both in December with notice to proceed in January. The Sheriff's Office, County Attorney and Deputy County Administrator are working on developing the tower tenant lease agreement for Board approval in November/December.

BROADBAND PROJECT. We are still waiting for a decision on our USDA ReConnect application.



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2021-2025 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM. Work completed on the CIP for review by the County Administrator and adoption by the Board. We are working on a quarterly reporting mechanism on status of CIP projects and outcomes achieved through the various investments.

CENSUS 2020. The Census count completed on October 15, 2020. Through Empire State Development funding and agreement with the County, Catholic Charities (CC) completed public outreach to hard-to-count populations (seniors, minorities, low-income, homeless). CC distributed flyers, conducted door-to-door educational campaigns, created advertising in publications of wide circulation, worked with the OFA and others to help educate on census, and had computer access for individuals to use to complete the on-line questionnaire, as well as other activities. The grant also paid to have advertising on the RTS Livingston busses for the month of September. Livingston County has achieved a final housing unit Self-Response rate of 64.3% before Census Non-Response Follow Up (door-to-door). This Self-Response rate is above the NYS average. **What comes next:** By December 31, 2020, the Census Bureau will deliver apportionment counts to the President as required by law. April 1, 2021, the Census Bureau releases data and will send redistricting counts to NYS. This information is used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.

9:30 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – BILL BACON

Action Item(s) To Be Reported

1. PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE COUNTY'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CONTRACT WITH THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF COMMUNITY RENEWAL FOR A COUNTYWIDE MICROENTERPRISE PROGRAM.

RESOLVED, that the Livingston County Board of Supervisors hereby schedules a public hearing to be held on December 16, 2020 at 1:35 PM in the Board of Supervisors Assembly Room, Livingston County Government Center, Third Floor, Geneseo, New York, with the purpose of said hearing to provide information to the public regarding the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and to consider citizen comments regarding the County's contract with the NYS Office of Community Renewal to provide grants in conjunction with capacity building and entrepreneurial assistance to support and foster the development of microbusinesses. At least ten (10) days' notice shall be given by posting thereof on the bulletin board of the Government Center in this County and by publishing such notice at least one (1) time in the official newspaper of the County as provided by law.

Informational Item(s) Written Only

The LCDC has entered into a contract with Destination Development Association to conduct a county-wide assessment of the ways in which we can become a stronger, more successful destination for investment with regard to businesses and visitors as well as current and prospective residents. The end result will be a strategy and roadmap which will provide additional ways to achieve these desired outcomes.

Work is continuing on the Mani Street "anchor" project in Caledonia known as the Burgess Building (or Olympia Theater or "Q's"). The renovations include improvements to the entrance of the Raider Lanes bowling alley behind the building along with the full restoration and façade improvements on the main facility. The intent is to prepare the 1st floor for a food service business with a bar operator and food vendor(s). The 2nd floor is being restored to its historical use as an event center with a stage for multi-use purposes.

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The Office of Community Renewal (OCR) has asked Deputy Director, Maureen Wheeler, to participate on a statewide call featuring creative and successful ways to use CDBG funding to build tax base and create job opportunities for low-moderate income individuals. OCR has highlighted the Brew IN Livingston and Dream-O-Vate programs created by the LCDC as innovative and effective examples of award-winning results using microenterprise grant funds. The presentation takes place via Zoom on Thursday, October 29th.

Two new ribbon-cuttings are set to take place on October 26th and 29th for Sunrise Boulderling and Dublin Corners Farm Brewery Taproom. Both businesses are in Geneseo and are the last two remaining businesses to be highlighted from the Dream-O-Vate program. Congratulations to both participants and we wish them well in their new endeavors!

Three (3) projects were approved at the last IDA meeting for NY Portage I, LLC, Livingston Associates and Growmark. The NY Portage project is a ~5MW solar array located in the Town of Portage. The Livingston Associates project involves the new construction of a ~10,000sf building to be occupied by Power & Construction Group. P&CG will be warehousing supplies needed for much of their utility work which will allow them to better respond to the needs of their customer base in that business sector. Growmark is an existing company that has an 800 ton fertilizer facility in the Town of York. They are expanding the facility to 5000 tons of capacity to meet the existing demands from our agricultural community.

The closing for the transaction which transferred ownership from Livingston County to M&T Trucking on the (former) King Cole Bean location in the Town of York took place on October 6th. Work has begun by the new owners to repair the equipment and prepare it for grain storage.

1. Inspector payments are continuing to come in from the Village Elections. Delinquent payments are being followed up on.
2. A third voucher has been submitted to NYS BOE for the CARES funding.
3. General Election 2020 is in full swing. As of this writing, we have mailed 5,317 absentee ballots; 3,527 have been returned. Tuesday, October 27 is the last day to request an absentee by mail. Early Voting began on Saturday, October 24. We have a three day total of 1,387 so far. Please note that voter numbers are posted on the website daily.
4. A ballot box has been installed in the Government Center Lobby for people who would rather drop off their ballot than return it by mail. Executive Order directive prevents a voter from waiting in a line who has a ballot to drop off.
5. Inspectors have been scheduled and all poll sites will be open on Election Day.
6. Media reports/hype have resulted in a significant increase of calls to BOE.
7. Inspectors have been scheduled to supplement the increased workload of absentee and early voters. They are working in bipartisan teams to assist in mailing absentees; signature verification, early voting; packing supplies for election day, etc.
8. Current active voter enrollment stands at 39,999. Democratic: 10,403; Republican: 17,412; Conservative: 914; Working Families: 117; Green: 131; Libertarian: 144; Independence: 1,889; Blank-No Party: 8,623; Oth-Blank: 50; Oth-WEP: 9; and Oth-Reform: 7. Inactive enrollment is at 2,028. Total active/inactive voter enrollment: 42,027.
