ROLL CALL

The roll was called showing all members present except Mr. Wadsworth (Geneseo).

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The County Administrator introduced US Army Veteran, Robert Wolter, Jr.:

Sergeant Major Robert A. Wolter Jr. is a retiree of the United States Army. He enlisted in October 1995 after graduating from Livonia Central High School. He completed his Army Basic Training and Advanced Individual Training and Airborne School at Fort Benning, Georgia as an Airborne Infantryman.

He was then assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 504th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. In June of 2000, he transferred to the New York Army National Guard and was assigned to Alpha Company, 2nd Battalion, 108th Infantry in Geneseo.

In December 2003 he was hired as a full-time Active Guard-Reserve (AGR) and was promoted to Squad Leader. He later served as a Weapons Squad Leader and Platoon Sergeant in the same company. Upon promotion to First Sergeant in May 2014, he was assigned to The Fighting 69th as First Sergeant for Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion, 69th Infantry while also taking over as the full-time AGR Battalion Operations Non-Commissioned Officer for 1-69th Infantry in New York City, New York. In January 2018, he was promoted to E-9, Sergeant Major, and transferred back to the Geneseo where he served as the Battalion Operations NCO until September 21, 2022 when he retired just shy of 27 years of service.

He is a graduate of the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy, Advanced Non-Commissioned Officer Course, Army's Basic Non-Commissioned Officer Course, Professional Leadership Development Course, Basic Airborne School, Jumpmaster School, and Pathfinder School.

Bob has deployed to Kosovo, Afghanistan and Kuwait as well as mobilizations to Niagara Falls Air Reserve station, New York COVID Response, Washington D.C., and several State Active Duty Missions throughout his career with the New York Army National Guard. He has also participated in foreign unit exchange programs with both the British and German militaries, as well as training missions in Kazakhstan, Australia, and the Dominican Republic.

His awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Army Valorous Unit Award, Army Meritorious Unit Citation, Army Good Conduct Medal, Army Reserve Component Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Kosovo Campaign Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Army NCO Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Army Overseas Service Ribbon, Army Reserve Overseas Training Ribbon, NATO Medal, Combat Infantry Badge, Senior Parachutist Badge, Pathfinder Badge, British Parachutist Badge, Russian Parachutist Badge, German Edelweiss, German Schützenschnur ("shoots-zen-snare"), and the Order of St. Maurice.

Bob is now employed as the Livingston County Peer Support Specialist of Veteran One-Stop Center of Western New York working out of the County's Veteran Services Agency office in Mt Morris. Bob is married to his wife Brittany and they have two daughters, Brittney, and Brianna.

INTRODUCTION OF LOCAL LAWS

1. LOCAL LAW NO. C-2022 OVERRIDING THE TAX LEVY LIMIT FOR LIVINGSTON COUNTY FOR THE 2023 FISCAL YEAR

Chairman LeFeber asked the County Administrator to comment on the local law.

Ian Coyle explained that since the introduction of Tax Levy Cap Law the County has not had to employ this particular local law. In the possibility that we *may, not will* have to override the tax cap this year, this local law includes authorization to have the Board override the tax levy and follow the laws of the Tax Cap. This does set up a local law and a separate public hearing that would be held on November 16 if we do indeed need to override the tax levy limitations. We don't have the ability to utilize the entirety of our carryover from the previous year because we actually went down last year, so the portion that we can carry over plus the small inflation factor probably will not be enough for the total levy impact this year. In the event that it is not, we are covered by doing the override.

2. LOCAL LAW D-2022 UPDATING APPORTIONMENT FOR THE LIVINGSTON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ON A WEIGHTED VOTE BASIS

Chairman LeFeber asked the County Attorney to comment on the local law.

The County Attorney explained that this particular local law implements an adjusted weighted vote plan for the Livingston County Board of Supervisors based upon the population count of the 2020 Census. Said plan was created in consultation with the Center for Governmental Research and provided the fairest distribution of voting power among Board members.

After ample discussion, the Committee found that the Department would greatly benefit from the disbursement of a portion of the County’s awarded ARPA funds. The Workforce Development Department’s intended use of the funds meets the United States Department of Treasury’s

guidelines as to how the ARPA funds are to be spent and granting a portion of these funds to this Department would provide great benefit to Livingston County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Ways and Means Committee specifically endorsed an allocation of \$100,000.00 of ARPA funds to the Livingston County Workforce Development Department for job training services for Livingston County residents; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that in support of the Ways and Means Committee's recommendations, the Livingston County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the disbursement of County ARPA Funds to the Livingston County Workforce Development Department for the amount requested and for the uses indicated in this Resolution; and be it further

WHEREAS, reliable, high-speed, affordable access to internet service is imperative for Livingston County residents, businesses, farms, schools, nonprofit organizations, and visitors; and

WHEREAS, investment in internet service will foster economic development, job growth, rural entrepreneurship, and innovative technologies; and

WHEREAS, Livingston County completed an engineering study and public input survey which concluded that internet service is either unavailable or of an inadequate quality for many residents, farms and businesses throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, Livingston County wants to prioritize the deployment of broadband infrastructure and wishes to pursue public-private partnerships and funding sources in an effort to effectively achieve greater access to reliable and affordable high-speed internet service throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) issued a solicitation of applications for the fourth round of the Rural e-Connectivity Pilot Program (ReConnect) to expand broadband service to rural areas that lack sufficient access to broadband; and

WHEREAS, Livingston County issued a Request for Proposals seeking a public-private partnership for purposes of applying to the USDA ReConnect program for eligible areas, and one proposal was received; and

WHEREAS, Empire Access was determined to be the most qualified to serve as the private partner; and

WHEREAS, should funding be awarded, Livingston County will provide the 25% cost share grant funding match required under the terms of the Program with the understanding that the County will recover said contribution pursuant to the terms of a negotiated financial agreement with Empire Access; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Livingston County wishes to partner with Empire Access in jointly preparing an application to the USDA ReConnect Program and hereby fully supports Empire Access as the lead applicant; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Livingston County Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to sign a letter to the USDA declaring the County's intent to partner with Empire Access and provide the required grant funding match for the cost of the project, should funding be awarded.
