After presentation by Joshua J. Tonra, Assistant District Attorney, the following case was handled in the Livingston County Court before the Honorable Robert B. Wiggins on October 4, 2016.

JAMES R. BROWN, age 32, of Rochester pled guilty to Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the Second Degree (Misdemeanor) and the matter was adjourned to January 3, 2017.

JOHN M. COLON, age 27, of Rochester was charged with Criminal Sale of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree (B Felony), Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Third Degree (B Felony), and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Seventh Degree (misdemeanor). He was arraigned with his attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to January 3, 2017.

JUSTIN S. FORD, age 34, of Livonia was sentenced on a conviction of Criminal Sale of Marihuana in the Second Degree (D Felony) to 90 days incarceration and 5 years probation. He was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee. His license was suspended.

BRANDON E. JENKINS, age 35, of Mt. Morris, convicted of Grand Larceny in the Fourth Degree (E Felony), appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to November 1, 2016.

ROBERT C. KENDALL, age 33, of North Rose was charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony), Driving While Intoxicated (E Felony), Failure to Stop at a Stop Sign, Improper U-Turn, and Possession of an Alcoholic Beverage in a Motor Vehicle. He was arraigned without an attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to October 18, 2016. His license was suspended pending prosecution.

JOHN PATRICK MANN age 26, of Nunda, charged with Promoting Prison Contraband in the First Degree (D Felony) and Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Seventh Degree (misdemeanor), appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned to November 1, 2016.

LOIS L. MARK, age 53, of Dansville, charged with Criminal Contempt in the First Degree (E Felony), Criminal Mischief in the Third Degree (E Felony), Attempted Assault in the Second Degree (E Felony), and Reckless Endangerment in the First Degree (D Felony), appeared with her attorney and the matter was adjourned to October 11, 2016. Bail was continued at \$3500.

RYAN P. MOSHER, age 24, of Mt. Morris was charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony), Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs (Misdemeanor), Driving While Ability Impaired by the Combined Influence of Drugs (Misdemeanor), Resisting Arrest (Misdemeanor), and False Personation (Misdemeanor). He was arraigned with his attorney, pled not guilty, and the matter was adjourned to October 18, 2016. Bail was set at \$10,000.

TRICIA A. THOMPSON, age 41, of Dansville was sentenced on a conviction of Sex Offender Failure to Register or Verify (E Felony) to 6 months intermittent incarceration. She was also ordered to pay a \$325 surcharge and a \$50 DNA fee.

MELINDA E. TORRES, age 29, of Livonia, charged with two counts of Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the First Degree (E Felony), Driving with .08 of One Percent or More of Alcohol in Her Blood (Misdemeanor), Driving While Intoxicated (Misdemeanor), and Operating a Motor Vehicle without Tail Lights, appeared with her attorney and the matter was adjourned to October 21, 2016. She was remanded to the Livingston County Jail without bail.

DANIEL D. TREWER, age 40, of Wayland, charged with Robbery in the First Degree (B Felony), two counts of Robbery in the Second Degree (C Felony), Assault in the Second Degree (D Felony), Grand Larceny in the Fourth Degree (E Felony), and Tampering with Physical Evidence (E Felony), appeared with his attorney and the matter was adjourned for further proceedings.
