Livingston County Sees Increase in Active COVID-19 Cases

Mount Morris, NY, November 28, 2020 — The Livingston County Department of Health (LCDOH) reports that, as of November 27, 2020, there are 51,985 negative and 705 positive cases of COVID-19 in Livingston County. Of these positive cases, 93 are currently active.

According to Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County's Public Health Director, "This reported case count represents the highest peak of active cases in Livingston County since the beginning of the pandemic."

In addition, County Administrator Ian M. Coyle reports that the Livingston County Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation (CNR) is experiencing an uptick in cases. He stated, "We remain strong in our resolve to prevent the virus from further spreading within both the nursing home and the community. All residents are strongly encouraged to do their part. Please follow COVID-19 guidelines and protocols to assist us in this public health battle."
