Mount Morris, NY, January 26, 2021 — In celebration of Livingston County's Bicentennial, the County Historian's Office is pleased to announce the launch of the **Historical Marker Heritage Trail**.

Dozens of blue-and-gold signs dot the landscape across Livingston County, marking historically significant people, places, and events and helping to educate the public and promote historical tourism. Most of these signs were erected between 1926 and 1936 by the State Education Department as a way to commemorate historic sites during the 150th anniversary of the American Revolution. Since that time many new markers have been added and several of the original signs have been restored.
