## I. Collection Summary

<b>Abstract</b>	<p>This collection, compiled by Linda Dodd, is based on 137 original letters to Charles Monroe Root (1872-1930) of Springwater, Livingston County, New York and Rochester, New York. Letters addressed to Root are from a variety of friends and family, including girlfriends, half-sister Zella A. (Root) Farley and parents James Monroe Root and Adelaide (Hopkins) Root. Letters are personal and chatty in nature and represent a period of time when Charles Root lived in Rochester and corresponded with those in Springwater. The Emory Thayer murder at Avon, Livingston County, New York in 1885 is discussed.</p>

## II. Biographical and Background Information

According to Linda S. Dodd (1944-2011), who transcribed and annotated the original letters in the collection, Charles Monroe Root, grew up on a farm in Springwater, Livingston County, New York. He was a son of James Monroe Root and Adelaide (Hopkins) Root. When he was about 15 years old, he was sent to Rochester to live with his married half-sister, Zella (Root) Farley, and her husband, Scott Farley. While living in Rochester, Charles Root attended Mechanic's Institute, which later became Rochester Institute of Technology.

Charlie corresponded with family and friends while he lived in Rochester. His parents wrote often, and Charlie's friends kept up a regular correspondence, keeping him informed of the goings-on in Springwater. The letters are almost entirely social in nature, and tell very little of the daily tasks required to survive at the turn of the 20th century.

Included in the collection are references to the Emory Thayer murder in Avon in 1885 and the subsequent arrest of Samuel Wayman and others in 1890.

In 2004, Linda Dodd transcribed 137 original letters written to Charles Monroe Root during his time in Rochester. She created a simple HTML website where the transcriptions include links to information about correspondents and events. These HTML documents are saved on the Livingston County network drive along with word processor documents containing the transcriptions for duplication and security.

The original letters are folded in original envelopes and stored in archival acid-free tissue and archival box and have not been digitized.

The letters and binder of transcriptions, along with two CDs containing transcriptions, digital images, and HTML documents, were donated to the Livingston County Historian's Office by Linda Dodd in 2005. After Dodd's death, her husband donated a folder of genealogical notes and correspondence conducted by Linda Dodd during her research on the collection as well as a folder of research on the Emory Thayer murder case.
