Towns to Offer Limited Quantities of Free COVID-19 Test Kits and KN95 Masks to Residents

GENESEO, N.Y., January 6, 2022 — Over the past few weeks, Livingston County had been tentatively planning for a countywide COVID-19 test kit and KN95 mask distribution event on January 8, 2022. However, due to circumstances beyond the County's control, the number of at-home test kits received from New York State was substantially lower than anticipated and does not provide us the ability to conduct this event.

Livingston County did receive approximately 2,800 at-home test kits, which will be divided up and delivered to each town for distribution to their residents on a first come, first served basis. The County will also distribute around 1,000 KN95 masks to each town.

"At-home test kits are currently in short supply within our area, throughout the state, and across the nation," said Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle. "We want to get this limited supply to our communities as quickly as possible."

Please check with your local Town Hall for information on how to receive an at-home test kit and KN95 mask.

The community test kit and mask distribution events specific to residents of ZIP codes 14486, 14533, 14545 and 14846 are scheduled for today, January 6, 2022, from 3:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. at the York Town Hall, Scottsburg Community Center, and Portage Town Hall. The supplies for these events were provided separately by the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) as part of a State-recommended distribution plan for target communities with low vaccination rates.
